7	H	Travel from Petra to Aqaba Enjoy some beach/pool time and explore the city	Aqaba

Notes / Possible Alterations

- With more time, consider:
 - Adding an overnight stay in the desert at Wadi Rum while in the Aqaba area
 - Add time at the [Dana Biosphere](#) or for hiking the canyons of [Wadi Mujib](#)
 - Spending a few days in Israel to see the various religious sites
- In Jordan, it is easiest to get around by car and most people typically hire a driver. The roads are not crowded but speeds are high and it can be nice to have someone fluent in Arabic with you, particularly when passing through smaller towns that don't see many tourists.
